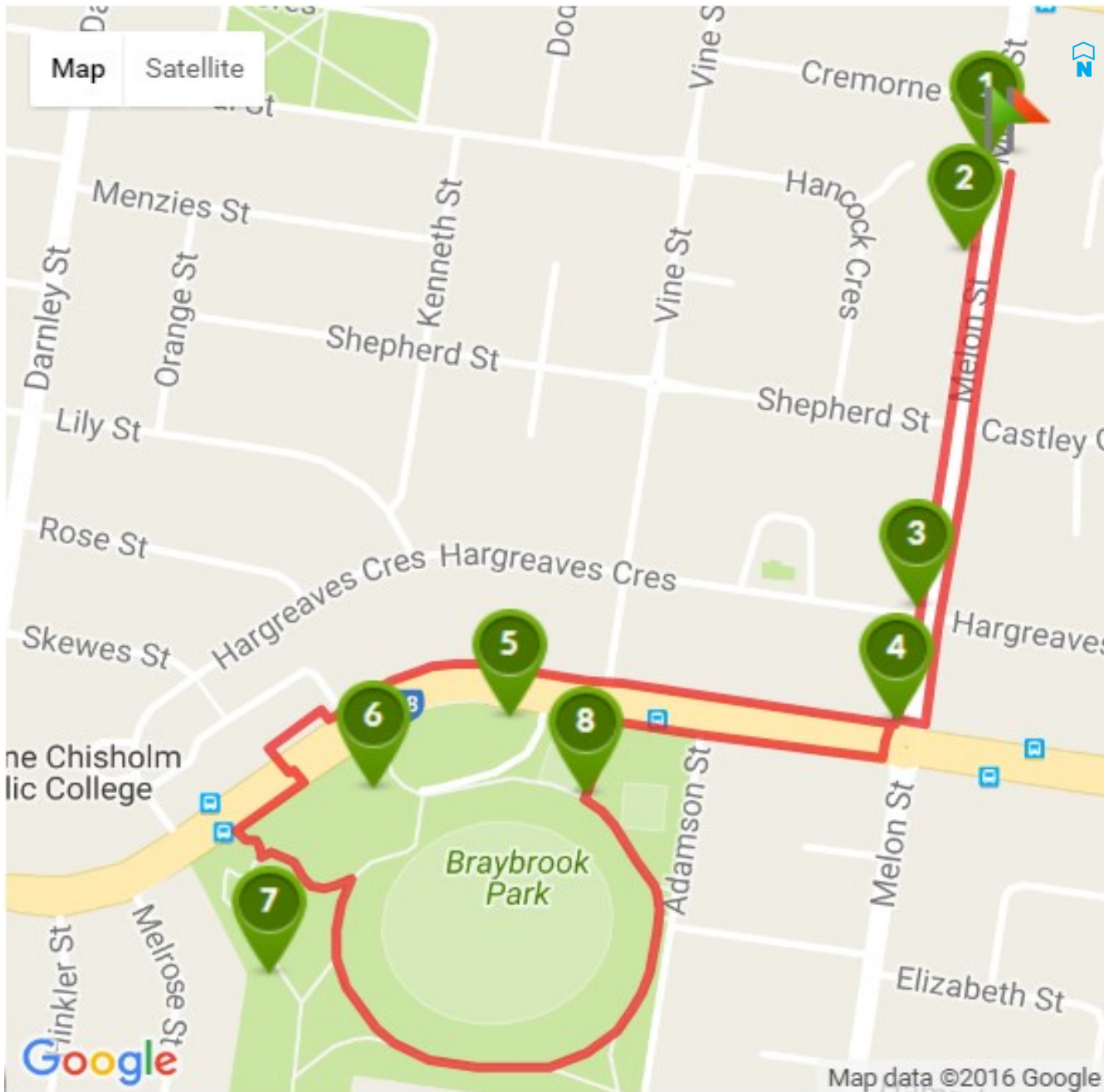
Let's Walk Braybrook Park

Length: 2.5 km Time: 36 mins



A pleasant, easy walk with city views, taking in gardens and a temple.

Description

Meet up with friends at Braybrook & Maidstone Neighbourhood House, or anywhere along this loop walk. Chat to locals as you stroll down Melon street.

Did you notice the beautiful old wheelbarrow full of succulents?

Be amazed by the topiary dragon in the Vietnamese Cao Dai Temple garden. Walk up to the shops on Churchill Avenue to find the barber, baker, chemist, coffee and lunch.

Cross over Churchill Avenue and drop into the Braybrook Community Hub to see what's on. Wander around the Braybrook Park track. Notice the Braybrook Commons Community Gardens and admire the sculptures created by local artists.
