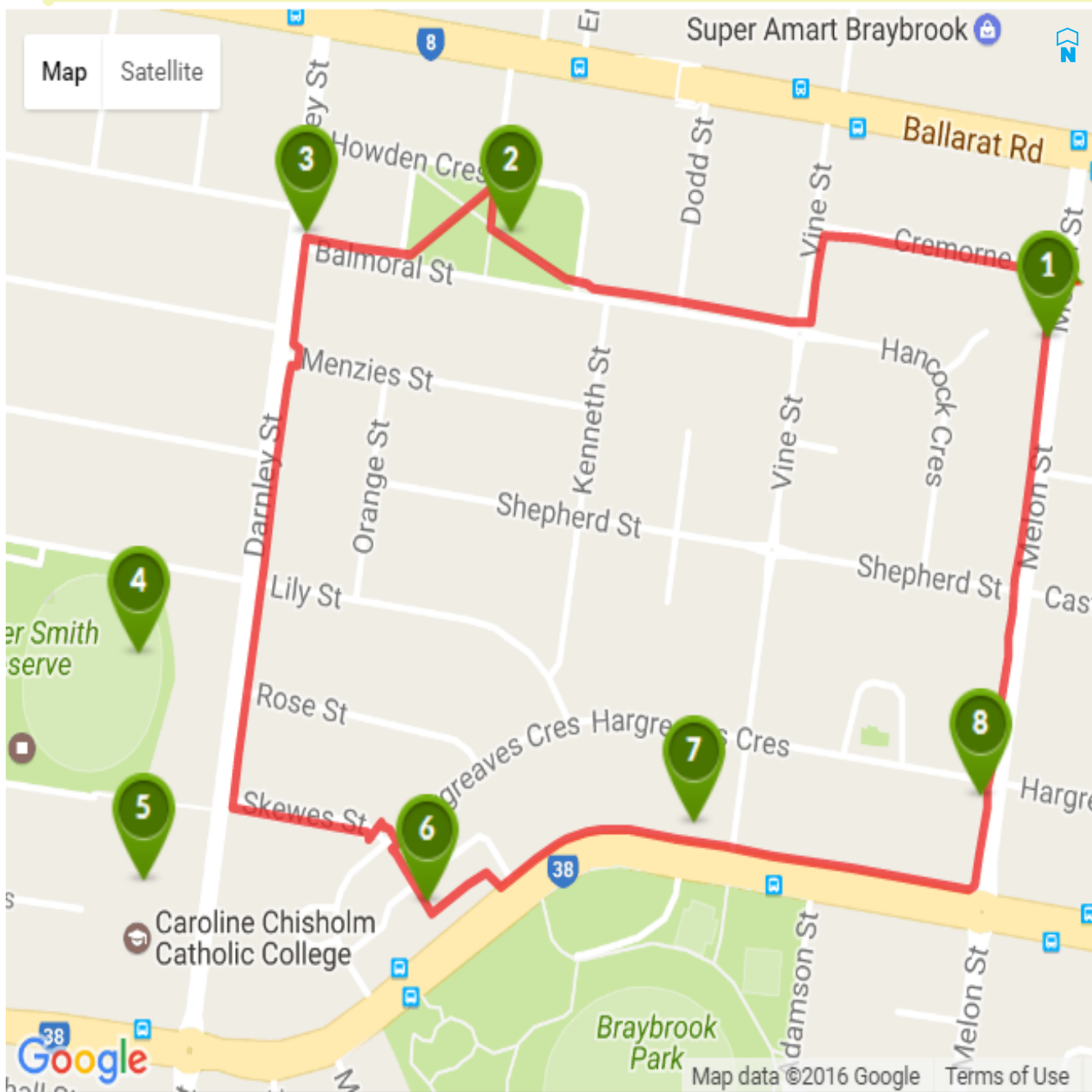
Let's Walk Braybrook Streets

Length: 2.5 km Time: 37 mins



This easy neighbourhood walk will take you to Darnley Street and Churchill Avenue via Ash Reserve. Check out the Churchill Avenue shops and the Vietnamese Temple on the way back along Melon Street.





Description

This neighbourhood loop walk takes in Braybrook and Maidstone Neighbourhood house and Cremorne Street, with its shady trees and abundant gardens.

See if you can spot the Bird of Paradise growing on the right as you walk towards Vine Street. Turn left then right to Ash Reserve and enjoy a moment of relaxation.

Turn left onto Darnley street, taking in the green views of Kinder Smith Reserve and surrounds.

Cross the road and let the children run wild in the new playground. Walk around the oval if you have time. You'll love the new artwork and shop fronts you'll see on the way back!
