Photos & Points of Interest

Point(s) of Interest

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- School vegie garden**
If you peek in the cracks between the fence, you'll see the school garden! I think it would be good if the school had a wire fence so you can see what's growing there.
- Lawn Bowls Club**
They play mostly on Saturday mornings I think. I've seen lots of people here, in their best whites (probably why I'd never be able to play - all my whites are attracted to food stains).
- Bridges Reserve**
A lovely park to sit in, with benches, a weird sculpture and a bright red mural on the walking path. There's also a monument to Henry (who's Harry?), lovely towers and a funny shaped tree.
- House on the corner**
Who knows what this is! There's no explanation, I asked a bloke passing by - his theory was that it was a house for the pigeons.

Description

1. Start at the corner of Bridport and Montague St - Facing west, the Albert Park Library is on your left as is the Albert Park Hotel - a great seafood bar!
2. Heading west you'll see cafes, restaurants and bookshops either side of Bridport St.
3. Just east of the corner of Bridport, Mortlar St and Victoria Avenue you'll see the Avenue Bookstore - definitely worth a leisurely browse.
4. On your right you'll see the Albert Park Primary School - a great playground which is open to all on weekends.
5. If you keep heading west towards the beach and just over Robertson St, you'll see more cafes and restaurants all lovely. Then there's Jock's. Famous for its ice-cream - worth a visit either on your way to or from the beach.
6. When you come out of Jock's ice-cream in hand, cross Victoria Avenue and turn right into Barrett St. On your right, on the one of Barrett and Withers St you'll see the Fairy Tree. A delight at any time but lit with fairy lights (of course!) at night around Christmas.
7. Cross Withers St and walk another block until you come to Foote St and the Gasworks Park - a favourite with dogs and humans alike. There you can sit in the shade while you finish your ice-cream or explore. There are artists studios, a theatre and a cafe. And on the 3rd Saturday of the month there's a Farmers Market (9.30am - 1.00pm). Remember to bring your green bags. In the park you'll also come across various wonderful sculptures and installations.
8. Head out of the park, turn right into Foote St and continue west towards the beach. You can take a detour through the new Albert Park Secondary College - and if you happen to have a basketball with you, shoot a few hoops.
9. At the end of Foote St you'll reach Beaconsfield Pde and South Melbourne Beach.
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11. Turning right you'll see Station Pier an easy walk away.
12. Cross Beaconsfield Pde, head onto the beach, take your shoes and sodas off and go for a paddle. Turning left you'll come across the Plum Gairland Playground - another favourite with our kids - and if you keep walking another couple of hundred metres you'll come to the Karford Rd Pier - there'll you find another cafe and often, hopeful and sometimes successful fisher people.
13. Walk back to Victoria Ave and either walk back up Victoria Ave stopping to get fish and chips, have a drink or coffee and cake or hop on the #1 train into town.
