Activity Sheets

'As easy as ABC' walk



A fun discovery walk around the neighbourhood.







You will need:


- · comfortable shoes
- piece of paper with the alphabet printed or written on it
- pen

This is a great activity for children learning the alphabet.

Start your walk at the beginning of the alphabet. As you walk, encourage children to notice something beginning with 'A' (e.g. ants, apple tree), followed by B and so on. Children can take turns if there is more than one child.

See if you can get through the alphabet by the end of your walk, checking letters off your piece of paper along the way. It's very satisfying to get all the way to Z (hmm ... hopefully you'll see a zebra crossing!)

TOP TIP: Why not take this walk to or from kindergarten or school – children can practise their ABC and share with you what they have learned.
